

## Saskatoon Quilters' Guild Mystery Quilt - BLOCK NUMBER 3

### Card Trick Block:

This pattern can be challenging so pay close attention to the instructions. We found it most helpful to mark your pattern as shown on the pattern pages we've supplied.

More experienced quilters may prefer to cut the fabric according to the block's instructions and lay them out as shown in the diagram on page 3. Then sew the block pieces together in the order of your choice.

# ARD TRICK

This makes a 12" block :o)

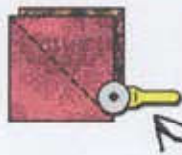

## \*\* Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block \*\*

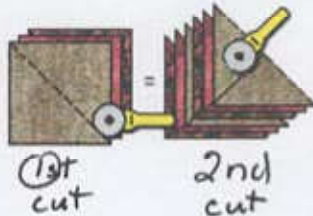
①



**DARK MEDIUM**

Stack a Color 2 and Color 3 4-7/8" square, and using a rotary cutter, cut on the diagonal to make two half square triangles of each...

**Backgd Dark Med**

Stack the Color 1, Color 2 and Color 3 5-1/4" squares. Using a rotary cutter, cut through all on the diagonal, then cut through the resultant triangles again on the other diagonal to make four quarter square triangles of each...

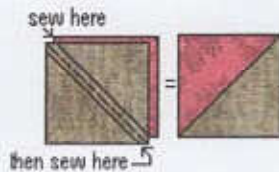

**Backgd Dark**

Now speed piece the Color 1/Color 2 half squares, by stacking one 4-7/8" square of each right sides together and all edges aligned. Mark the diagonal on the back of the top square, and sew a scant 1/4" above and below this marked line, then cut apart ON the marked line to give you two half squares. Press seam to darker side. Trim to measure 4-1/2" if needed...

**Backgd Med**

Repeat the previous step using Colors 1 and 3, to make two half squares of this color combination...

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# Card Trick - Page 2

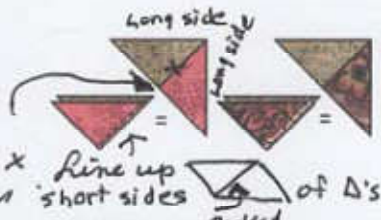

Next sew a Color 3 quarter triangle to a Color 1 quarter square triangle, pressing seams towards the darker color. Press seam to darker side. Make two of these, then make two more using Colors 1 and 2... Backgd Dark

Sold your  $\frac{1}{2}$  sq  $\Delta$  in half +  
match down the 2 points  
of your crease  
the halfway

 $\frac{1}{2}$  sq.  $\Delta$ 's this will be the

To the Color 1 and 3 combo units, sew a Color 2 half square triangle. Trim to measure 4-1/2" if needed. Make two of these...  
Tip-fold Color 2 in half (long side) crease center  
mark, match crease line to seam of the 1&3 combo unit

To the Color 1 and 2 combo units, sew a Color 3 half square triangle. Trim to measure 4-1/2" if needed. Make two of these...

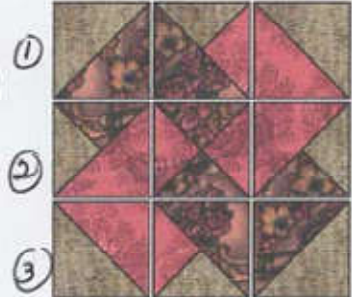


Sew the remaining quarter square triangles together in two Color 2/Color 3 combos, and then sew these together to make a quarter square. Trim to measure 4-1/2" if needed...  
Make sure your color combinations are the same as in the diagrams.

Press row 1 seams  
to the right

Row 2 seams  
to the left  
Row 3 seams  
to the right.



Now piece the Block in the order shown at left. First make rows, and then join them to make the block. Alternate pressing directions by row to avoid bulky seams!

Match your  
seams using  
the 

Pin method  
to hold the nested seams together.
